HD Line-up Expands to 21 Channels throughout Desert Cities

Palm Desert, CA, December 19, 2007 — Time Warner Cable announced today the addition of four new high definition channels to its line-up in Desert Cities, effective on December 27.

The four new channels bring Time Warner Cable's HD channel count to 21 in Desert Cities.

Desert Cities TV (formerly TV10) is home to the KTLA morning and evening news shows as well as the local programs viewers have enjoy such as The Car Nut with Steve Parker, Conversations with Gloria Greer, and Talk of the Desert with Melinda Read. Beginning January 12th, Desert Cities TV will carry the Clippers games as broadcast by KTLA.

Time Warner Cable announced the relocation of two other channels. CSPAN will be located on channel 10 and Telefutera will be on channel 25.
